Have you pruned back your roses or planted any bare root ones? Otto & Sons told us that should be done in January, but I'm sure you can still do it. Remember to "top" them first to about three feet. Clear away dead leaves from around the base. Cut off dead and cross branches. Make sure you al-

so cut branches in the center to make a bowl shape so the air can circulate, especially with hybrid teas. Fertilize and spray for diseases also. And wear heavy gloves! I frequently come back in the house dripping blood.

The rain was great! Everything looks so fresh and clean, even though the weeds are having a party. My back is aching just thinking about them. Oh well, it's part of being a gardener.


